SATURDAY, OCTOBER 6, BAIR ISLAND, 9 AM — Visit Bair Island to see the birds of fall there and to hear some of the history and status of the restoration plans. Shorebirds and raptors put on a good show. Take 101 to Whipple Avenue exit in Redwood City, go east on Whipple and cross the frontage road. There is parking here, but do watch out for the frontage road traffic as you pull in. Meet at 9 AM by the Refuge sign just inside the big, white gates.
